- Bug-related issues:
 - test sensitivity to RV stream assignment? (#586/#728)
 - TCP BBR issues (#827, others)
 - TCP SACK (#805) and other TCP issues
 - Ipv6 Ping fragmentation (#809)
- Maintenance issues:
 - modules with external dependencies-- move to app store
 - unmaintained modules (e.g. Wave, Wimax)-- move out
- Features:
 - NetDeviceState?
 - Removal of obsolete features?
 - Distribute 'nr' and other modules with release tarball?
